About Suffolk Lowland Search And Rescue

Sulsar is a voluntary organisation consisting of 100 plus members who are trained to national search standards as set by Lowland Rescue, our governing body. This is our 25th year in operation, with now many hundreds of searches logged. The team has grown in numbers over the past 10 years rising from 25 or so to its present.

We are deployed by Suffolk Police to assisting them in searching for vulnerable missing people or mispers within the county of Suffolk, and adjoining Counties when required by other team. We also work with Suffolk Fire and Rescue Service, deploying our water rescue and boats teams when required

All members give their time completely free and often deploy at short notice in what ever the weather happens to be when required, often dark, wet and cold.

We have specialist teams within the main team, such as drones, mountain bikes, dogs, kayaks, 4x4 support, boat, stealth, water search and medical, all teams remain part of the main team but can if needed deploy independently, and have their only kit and equipment.

We are funded completely by donations with running costs at around £15k per annum. Approximately £10k goes towards our building and insurance running costs, this continue continues to increase as we add to the services that we provide for Suffolk Constabulary, for instance we now carry out water searches and have been successful in finding evidence in a nasty stabbing case, we are currently looking at how our drone could be of more use to the police. The remainder goes towards equipment for the various teams, we are just in the process of purchasing a new RIB for the boats team. We are looking for grant funding to purchase more thermal imaging equipment, the list goes on

We are committed to finding the vulnerable people of Suffolk and will continue to do so for the next 25 years.

Thank you all for your support and for giving up your time to give enjoyment to so many people for charity.

I was introduced to Land Rovers at the age of 10 by my grandfather. My first LandRover was a 2000 Discovery TD5 but it wasn't until 2014 after buying my first Defender TD5 that I joined SLROC with the intention of joining Rover Rescue. Rover Rescue parted ways with SLROC about the same time, but I found playing in the mud and learning off road driving skills interesting, demanding and enjoyable. I became the Club secretary 2017 a position I still hold. When some other Club members got involved with Sulsar to provide Opps Support I also joined as the role was akin to my original objectives with Rover Rescue. Having spent two years with Opps I chose to qualify as a SuLSAR Search Tech. Last year I qualified as a pilot within the growing Drone Team and am currently training to become a Handlers assistant within the Dog Team.

I joined SULSAR in 2017 in the height of the Corrie searches. As a Mum the concept of loosing a child and never knowing what happened to them is beyond comprehension, so the thought that there are people out there that will pitch out whatever the time of day and whatever the weather to help look for a missing person is a huge comfort to the families of those people. However the benefits go both ways, I have met some of the most amazing people, Simon Foster being one of them and I feel immensely privileged to be able to stand beside them.

I have qualified as a Team Leader and am an active pert of the Kayak Team but my big love is the Dog Team and I'm currently a trainee dog handler with Idris who will hopefully qualify and become operational next year.

I have been operational on over 50 searches looking for suffolks missing and vulnerable people.



- Initial evaluation of nominations
 - Contact details
 - O What further information is available?
 - o Are up to date accounts available?
 - Initial assessment of nominations.
 - What proportion of their work is done in Suffolk?
 - Is the charity compatible with SLROC principles.
 - What is their charitable status? Are they a registered charity (some 'charities' with a small annual turnover have no registration, i.e. Bike Active, whom the Club supported some years ago)
 - What proportion of their income is for work at the 'coal face' and what proportion is to support administration?
- Making contact.
 - Establish personal contact and introduce SLROC, describe who and what we are and how we go about raising money for charity.
 - Ask them how they would spend a donation of a few thousand pounds.
 - o Could / would they support us by attending the shows with us and getting involved?
 - Have they any similar experience?
 - Do they see their involvement as a benefit and how would they hope to gain from it?
 - Provide expected show and presentation dates.
- Review
 - The responses are collated for a review by the Committee.
 - The Committee review the information and raise questions as deemed fit. This may involve getting back to the charity for clarification.
- The decision
 - o The Committee vote and agree the chosen charities.
 - At Mince Pie Driving Day, the chosen charities for the following year are announced
 - Charity notice in January Nooze.

Please consider what charity you would like to nominate for 2024. It needs to be a charity that.

- o Spends its income at the 'coal face' not on administration and CEO salaries.
- Can identify how the club's donation would be used.
- Ensure the clubs donation benefits the people of Suffolk.
